







This young Maine Coon cat experienced entropion in only one eye. The eyelid position was corrected and prophylactic surgery was performed on the other eye to prevent problems.










This young Goldendoodle experience chronic squinting and discharge due to entropion. Her eyelid position and length were surgically corrected, resolving the irritation.









